

Christians often pray in a Church. They may visit a Church on a Sunday for Mass as this is their special day of the week.

When in the Church, Christians will pray whilst standing up, sitting down and kneeling down. They often sing hymns too which are a form of prayer.






Christians might also light a candle when inside the Church and say a prayer.

But Christians don't only pray inside a Church, they might pray in their home, in their garden, whilst they are out walking etc.

Now let's think about where Muslims pray and how they pray.



Prayer is one of the Five Pillars of Islam and is very important. Do you know how many times a day Msulims pray?

Before they pray, Muslims do Wudu which prepares them for Prayer. Watch the following clip that explains what Wudu is.
